Election Offences extract from SAMNUC Constitution 2023

Article 57. Election Offenses

1. The Electoral Commission shall disqualify a candidate or team from election for any of the following offenses committed either by a candidate or team or systematically carried out by his/her election team—

- a. rigging;
- b. use of physical force;
- c. abuse of social media in whatever form;
- d. intimidation and harassment;
- e. sorcery and magic;
- f. bribery;
- g. giving false or malicious information;
- h. mounting campaign posters for any candidate or team outside places designated for such posters;
- i. verbal abuse;
- j. foul language;
- k. slurs based on ethnicity, religion, gender, mode of study or year of study
- l. drunkenness and rowdiness;
- m. unauthorized vehicular processions inside of campus;
- n. campaigning outside the official campaign period;
- o. provocative and incendiary attacks on the Statutes, Regulations, and policies of the University College;
- p. defamation of any member of University College community;
- q. receipt of funding or any other support from political parties or any other interest groups from outside the University College student community.
- r. Impersonation
- s. Hacking of E-voting System

2. If the Electoral Commission convicts a winning candidate or team of an election offense, then it shall declare the candidate or team with the next highest number of votes to be the winner.
